Remember you have to help with an event as well as Ohio is a part of the entertainment. We will practice at Leadership in September.

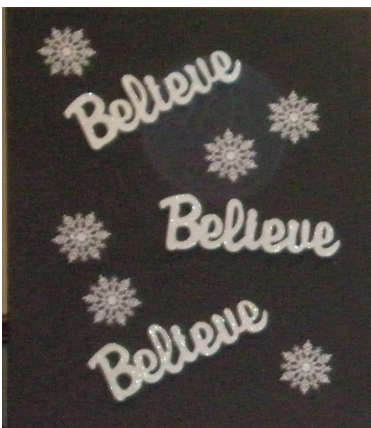

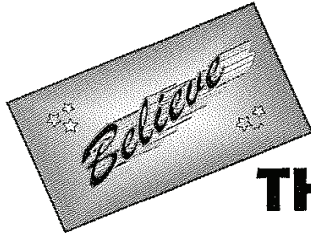
new ideas for your chapters on things to do for Easter Seals. With all the talent among you I think we can and will do a great job.

“The purpose of the ESA International Disaster Fund is to assist an ESA member whose home and/or personal belongings are destroyed or damaged extensively by one of nature’s causes – fire, flood, etc. Assistance may also be given when a member incurs heavy financial responsibility due to a debilitating illness or accident which involves her or the immediate family *who reside in her home and for whom she is legally responsible.*” The beginning balance last year was \$33,921.62 and contribu-

tions totaled \$61,011.58 along with \$25,000 transferred from the trust account and bank interest. There were 15 claims paid (\$65,475.00) plus postage/supplies, audit/tax preparation and bonds/insurance totaling \$67,614.48. \$52,433.82 was the balance transferred to the 2009-2010. The total contribution from Ohio was \$350. As you know, this fund is the only one designated for assistance to our own members and you have heard many stories about how important it has been to those

who needed to apply for it. Although we have had no claims in Ohio this year, there have been recipients in the past. My request to you is to be sure you have included Disaster Fund in your chapter budget for the 2009-2010 year. Please make your check out to ESA Disaster Fund and send your donation to me at 4096 Watercourse, Drive, Medina, OH 44256 to help keep this fund available for those who need it.
