Let's make this a big year for Ohio. Let's make our donations to the Disaster Fund early so our donations are there to help those in need.

Ohio has been very lucky as far as disasters, but our members in other states have not been so fortunate. Let's try to double our donations this year. If each chapter would have a small Ways & Means project with the proceeds going to the Disaster Fund think of how much Ohio could donate this year. (Something as small as a bake sale or white elephant sale at a chapter meeting would bring in enough to double last year's donation.)

Example of expenses: Two states, Kansas and Oklahoma, had 4 claims each amounting to \$20,000 for each state for

a total of \$40,000. There was a total donation of \$63,000 from all the states. That means if one more state or 4 more states had a total of 4 more claims the total donation from last year would have been gone.

Ohio could have one of these claims. What if one of our members needed \$5,000 to help them survive? Would our \$540 that we donated last year be enough to help? Let's see if we can double that this year.

I'd love to see 100% of our chapters donating to the Disaster Fund this year. Come on let's show those other states how generous OHIO is. I know we can do it.

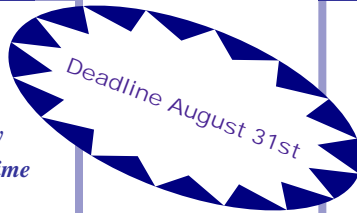
